WELCOME NOTES

Good afternoon everyone and welcome to our first home Sunday match here at Cobham.

Our visitors for this Pitching In Isthmian League South Central Division fixture are Metropolitan Police, who arrive here today in 18th place in the table, two places above us and with a one point advantage although we do have a match in hand.

We also thank them for coming to play us on a Sunday. We know it can be inconvenient but as 3G pitches continue to grow in popularity, this type of situation is likely to increase.



The immediate benefit of such a pitch was felt last Tuesday when the match here against Kingstonian would almost certainly have been postponed but for the 3G surface. As it was, the rain hardly mattered and both clubs contrived to put on a great match.

That said, K's probably would not have used the term 'great' as they found themselves on the wrong end of a 7-4 defeat, with Connor Cullen helping himself to four goals and giving a 'man of the match'performance. Our other scorers were: Basim Mirtahmasebi, skipper Sam Humphries, with an audacious clip and Scott Day who scored goal number seven. It is probably fair to say that the result caused a few reverberations around the League!

Football being what it is, it was maybe inevitable that we would put on a somewhat less impressive performance away to South Park on Saturday, a last-minute goal by our hosts resulting in a 3-0 defeat and we could have few complaints if we're honest.

A somewhat fussy referee, to say the least, aided by an assistant who couldn't even keep off the field of play at times, did not help as we racked up six player cautions - which means a minimum £250 fine from the FA.

Another referee would not have cautioned as many players. There is little doubt about that but collectively, as the Management also picked up two bookings, we must learn the lesson, however hard it may be, of just not speaking to officials when it was clear quite early on that the slightest indiscretion was likely to result in a sanction.

We can only put it behind us. Our next match after today arrives in just two days time, on Tuesday, when we make the fairly short journey to Leatherhead. They have had an inauspicious start to the season, very surprisingly, but form makes very little difference it seems. One has only to look at South Park, who after gaining their first league win of the season against us, proceeded to lose 5-0 at Hartley Wintney last Tuesday and we have already beaten Hartley at their ground in the League.

Another away game comes up next Saturday 26 October, when we travel to Rayners Lane, for the first time ever in a league match. Those of a certain age will though recall that Rayners Lane were our first ever FA Cup opponents, in a match at their ground that was remarkable for the fact that three players were hospitalised in the space of five minutes, all through accidental collisions. That match was drawn two goals apiece so it went to a replay at our ground which we lost by the only goal of the game and it was another four years before we could play in the FA Cup again - once we had finally acquired floodlights.

That is all for now. Enjoy the game

FOCUS ON METROPOLITAN POLICE

On 6th July 1829, Sir Robert Peel formed the Metropolitan Police, the first organised Police Force in the world, with an office overlooking the Thames at Whitehall known as Scotland Yard, a name that has become famous throughout the world, and also became synonymous with the Metropolitan Police.

Ninety years later, in 1919, the Metropolitan Police Football Club was formed, playing friendly matches until joining the Spartan League in 1928. Apart from the war years (1939-45), the club remained in that competition until 1960. During that time the Blues were League Champions eight times, runners-up once and League Cup winners once. In 1960 the Blues joined the Metropolitan League, winning the League Cup in 1969.

In 1971 the Blues were accepted into the Southern League and played in Division South until 1977, under team manager Vic Rouse, the former Wales and Crystal Palace goalkeeper.

In 1977, the Blues moved to the Isthmian

League, becoming one of the founder members of the restructured Division Two. A successful first season in 1977-78 resulted in the club finishing runners-up to Epsom & Ewell and being promoted to Division One. In season 1981-82 the club finished third in Division One, missing promotion by just two points.

In 1999-2000 reached the Fifth Round of the F.A. Vase (last eight), losing to the eventual winners Deal Town.

Throughout the first decade of the 2000s the club were mainly in and around the play-offs but were frustratingly defeated each time in the semis or the finals.

In the 2018-19 season Met Police had a tremendous run in the FA Cup reaching the First Round proper where they lost to AFC Newport County of League Two. The Blues also won the Surrey Senior Cup beating Tooting and Mitcham 2-0 in the final.

In the summer of 2023 Met Police decided to apply for relegation to Step Four, after losing their manager Gavin MacPherson and several players, and so returned to Isthmian League South Central Division.



METROPOLITAN POLICE

FOCUS ON METROPOLITAN POLICE

Metropolitan Police are currently sitting just above The Pitching In Isthmian League South Central Division relegation zone.

Going into today's game, the Blues and Twos have only won two of their 10 League games and also have drawn two games.

They started the season positively with a 4-1 victory

at Moneyfields where Mason Galloway ndtted twice with the other goals coming from Benjamin Mendoza and Sidney Gbla.

Their only other win was a 2-1 home success against Southall with Sidney Gbla getting both of the Met Police's goals.

The national cup competitions have been disappointing

being knocked out of the Emirates FA Cup by VCD Athletic while Westfield ended any interest in the Isuzu FA Trophy.

However, there has been success in the London Senior Cup, a 2-1 against Corinthian Casuals thanks to goals from Sidney Gbla and Ayoub Enajar. It is clear Gbla is a player to keep an eye on.

MET POLICE PEN PICS

ZACK BASEY - GOALKEEPER: Zack, 24, is no stranger to the blues, having previously been at the club. Zack has amassed plenty of experience at this level and has Merstham FC, South Park FC and Guildford City on his CV as previous clubs.

ALFIE WALTERS - DEFENDER: Alfie, 20, another to rise through the Met Youth ranks and with the U23's last season has had an excellent pre-season seeing off a lot of competition for the position. A very good defender who is also very impressive and comfortable in possession.

CHARLIE BROWN - CENTRAL MIDFIELDER: A talented and technical midfielder. The 25-year-old has already made an impact at Imber Court through his impressive performances throughout pre-season. Brown spent recent years on a US Footballing Scholarship at Roosevelt University, Chicago.

ISAAC NKOSI - CENTRAL DEFENDER: Isaac Nkosi, 29, another powerful central defender, has committed to the club after impressing throughout pre-season. Nkosi has a high footballing pedigree, with ex-clubs including Charlton Athletic, Bishops Stortford and Heybridge Swifts. He brings great experience and is a natural leader.

RYAN DAVEY - DEFENDER: Ryan, 27, is a Left footed Centre back and joined the blues from Bedfont FC. Comfortable on the ball and good in the air, Ryan has fitted well into the team since joining in January 2024. He has made an immediate impact in the heart of the blues defence and also showed his ability at the opposite end of the pitch by scoring on his debut in the win vs Southall. A fantastic addition to the squad.

KYNAN KIRLEW-WRIGHT - CENTRAL

DEFENDER: Kynan, 25, a Central Defender Kynan Kirlew-Wright signs for the Blues after an extremely successful and promising season at Farnham Town last time out. Wright will add strength and a strong desire to defend to our squad. The CB has non-league experience with Tooting & Mitcham and a loan spell with Erith Town as a teenager.

BEN MENDOZA - MIDFIELDER: Ben, 28, is a versatile and attacking flair midfielder. He brings experience and quality to the squad and has had a positive impact since joining from Chertsey Town. As a youth he won the Isthmian u18 league with Bognor before departing for the United states and was one of only five players to be placed on the river states conference mens soccer scholarathlete team that year. Ben's former clubs also include, Worthing, Bognor Regis, Chichester City and he also had a spell out in the USA playing for the University of Rio Grande.

AYOUB ENAJAR - DEFENDER: Ayoub 23, joined the Met in January 2024 as a Fullback. However it has transpired that his qualities are better served in the midfield. A hard working energetic player who puts everything on the line for the team. Ayoubs previous clubs include Leverstock Green and Hillingdon Borough.A versatile player who has added strength in depth to the squad.

SID GBLA - FORWARD: Sid, 28, is a prolific striker who finished last season with 39 Goals for Woodley United and Berks County. Electrifying pace, and clearly knows where the goal is. The blues were delighted to secure his services. He has had a good pre-season finding the net on several occasions and will no doubt continue doing so.

THE PITCHING IN ISTHMIAN LEAGUE NEWS ROUND-UP

KINGSTONIAN: Scott Harris returns to Kingstonian, only a few days after his departure.

Only five days after Kingstonian announced the departure of manager Scott Harris, the club last night announced that the former Walton and Hersham boss and serial promotion winner - had made a U-turn and returned to the club.

In a statement Kingstonian explained:

'We are delighted to announce the return of Scott Harris as our first team manager after positive discussions this week, during which Scott expressed his desire to return. We look forward to carrying on with our promising start to the season.

"We cannot stress enough our thanks to Dean Thomas and Mitchal Gough for taking over during this process. Dean will be taking up the role of assistant manager."

ASCOT UNITED have announced the signing of Khalid Simmo from St Albans City.

Khalid was with Marlow at the start of last season, playing eighteen times and scoring five goals.

He also played ten times for the club during the 22-23 season, scoring three goals, and twenty two times with five goals during 21-22. Last season also saw him turn out once for Badshot Lea.



As well as Marlow, 2022-23 also saw him spend some time with Uxbridge in between Marlow spells, playing three times with one goal.

During 2021-22 Simmo spent time at Ashford Town (Middx) and Hartley Wintney, although The Row were of course a Pitching In Southern League club at that point. Flackwell Heath and Reading City are also among his former clubs.

HARTLEY WINTNEY: A five-goal victory and a clean sheet on your debut - it couldn't have gone much better for keeper Jos Barker as he made his first start for Hartley Wintney in midweek.

Jos joins The Row on loan from Pitching In Southern Premier side Walton and Hersham. He has already made 14 appearances for the Swans this season, and joined the club in the summer from Knaphill, where he had already made 125 appearances since making his debut in 2021 aged seventeen. He was part of the English Universities Sport national squad while he was a student in Chichester.

FA Cup first round draw day is always one of the most eagerly-awaited of the non-league calendar.

It's the day when all those dreams and aspirations of drawing a big club are realised, when cup fever really kicks in.

Every year it throws up a tie or two to whet the appetites of the minnows, but this year's helping was unlike any other.

In fact, I can honestly say that the roll of the balls - served up by Bradford City legend Stuart McCall and former Manchester United and Salford City winger Danny Webber on Monday night – were about as kind to nonleague clubs as I've ever known it to be.

Not just the odd tasty match-up to help fill a few column inches in The NLP on a Sunday, but a whole host of absolute belters to ensure we are bursting with preview ideas in the build-up to the weekend of 2nd November.

Of the 40 ties pulled out of the hat, 23 see a non-league club pit their wits against their counterparts from Leagues One or Two. Eleven of those ties are at home, 12 away.

A further four are all-non-league affairs, ensuring there'll be plenty of interest in the second round too come 30th November.

While the grudge match between MK Dons and AFC Wimbledon will naturally be seen as the pick of the bunch by many, there are a number of mouth-watering ties with a strong derby feel.

Take Kettering Town, for example. The Poppies are already FA Cup folk heroes as the country's highest FA Cup goalscorers. Their 2-1 win at Farsley Celtic on Saturday extended their record to 920 – seven more than Tottenham Hotspur.

A healthy crowd gathered at the Latimer Park clubhouse on Monday night to witness their fate and they were toasting long into the night as they were handed an away tie to near neighbours Northampton Town.

Also celebrating a derby to savour were Weston-Super-Mare, who were handed an away tie at Bristol Rovers, and Alfreton Town, who will relish their short trip to face Notts County.

Elsewhere, Oldham Athletic boss Micky Mellon and striker James Norwood return to former club Tranmere Rovers, while Aldershot Town will be looking to repeat their heroics of last season when they make the trip to Bradford City's Valley Parade.

Of the non-league home ties drumming up interest, Tamworth are getting ready for a monster clash when Huddersfield Town, winners in 1921-22, visit The Lamb, while all eyes will also be on National League North high-flyers Curzon Ashton when they host Mansfield Town.

Southend United were rewarded for their lastgasp victory over Eastleigh in the last round with a home tie against Charlton Athletic, while Boreham Wood have pulled it out of the hat once again, this time landing a crunch home clash with League One Leyton Orient.

Wood's National League South rivals Chesham United were paired with League One Lincoln City, Woking pulled out struggling Cambridge United and Worthing will fancy their chances of an upset at home to Morecambe.

But the top pick must surely be Sutton United, who undoubtedly pulled out the plum draw – a home tie against big-spending League One title chasers Birmingham City.
