


MANAGER'S NOTES

Good evening everyone and a warm welcome to Binfield for this Pitching In Isthmian League South Central match at Cobham along with the referee Callum Parke and his assistants Promise Phillips and Matthew Childs.

Once again, we can only report another hard luck tale, following last Saturday's defeat at Hayes & Yeading, by our customary 2-1 scoreline.

Hayes & Yeading, by their own admission are not the force they were and we did more than enough to earn something from the game. However, a defensive lapse and penalty-kick for handball gifted our opponents two goals and whilst we threw everything at it after that, we were only able to pull one goal back.



Indeed it was a special shot, an absolute rocket from Alexander Paine. We fought to the end as we always do, a little too much for Rhys Paul who found himself the recipient of a d card when a full-blooded tackle took man and ball. It was too late though to make very much difference and Rhys will remain eligible to play this evening as his suspension as his suspension does not start until tomorrow.

Prior to the Hayes & Yeading match we played away to Horndean in the League on Saturday 30th November. Horndean were transferred from the Isthmian League South East Division and we had never played them before. They have been holding their own and much of the match was even enough but we did have a number of chances near the end to secure what would have been a valuable three points but in the end a draw was probably about right with no one from either side able to put the ball in the net.

We are now in the festive period of course and our programme over the holiday period reads:

Thursday 26th December, away to Westfield; Saturday 28th December, home to Harrow Borough; Wednesday 1st January, home to Hanworth Villa

The match away to Westfield kicks off at 12 midday while the other two are both at the customary time of 3pm.

The League has insisted that the 42- day rule in which to arrange and play any previously postponed match must be followed, so it has meant that we have had to ask Cobham and Met Police to postpone an Under-18s match in order for us to play Guernsey on Tuesday 21st January. We apologise to both clubs that we have found ourselves in this position. We also have to fit in a home County Cup match against South Park in the near future but we have not (yet) come under any pressure from Surrey County FA. It may be though that we can hire a further venue for that one which would be acceptable to the County. We certainly don't wish to disrupt our hosts again.

These notes are being written on Tuesday 17th December but on Thursday a site meeting was due to take place at Short Lane when we would receive an update from the contractors. We will be hoping for good news.

HORNDEAN have announced the departure of manager Michael Birmingham, who leaves the club to become joint manager of Pitching In Isthmian Premier side Bognor Regis Town.

Birmingham took over at the Deans in the summer of 2016, and his first home game brought in a crowd of 54 which contrasts with the 1,359 who packed the Stanley Chase Stadium as his Deans won the Wessex League title at the end of the 22-23 season, a campaign which also saw them win the Portsmouth Senior Cup at Fratton Park.

Last season saw a comfortable transition to Step Four, and this season he has guided them to another steady start as they moved over to the South Central Division. He is a former Bognor player, and understandably couldn't resist the lure of a return to Nyewood Lane, where he will manage alongside Jamie Howells.

REVIEW: Pitching In Isthmian South Central bottom side Badshot Lea played host to Rayners Lane on Tuesday, and the Baggies came within eight minutes of picking up what would have been three priceless points, only for Lane skipper - and leading scorer- Frank Keita to decide otherwise.

The bottom place Baggies had only one win all season and found themselves twelve points from safety at kick off, but they had a perfect start, Joe Lewis making the breakthrough in the very first minute but they had to settle with a 1-1 draw.

BINFIELD HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world.

The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield.

The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the Second World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as First Division Champions.

The 2023-24 season will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only four points and were rooted to the bottom of the Pitching In

Isthmian League South Central table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a replay against Northwood.

A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with eight wins and managed to finish four points and one position above the relegation zone.

It is widely believed that manager Ross Weatherstone performed the Great Escape last season to prevent Binfield being relegated from the Pitching In Isthmian League South Central Division.

When Weatherstone took over, Binfield were adrift at the bottom of the table with only four points but the Moles scrambled to safety.

Weatherstone has managed to consolidate Binfield's position

in the League this season although their performances have been unspectacular but they appear to be clear of relegation trouble.

Their form in the League since early November, when they defeated Southall 2-0, has been mixed.

They have suffered defeats against Hanworth Villa and Westfield but managed a 4-3 success against Harrow Borough. A 0-0 draw with high-flying Kingstonian followed before a two-week break because of postponed games.

On their return, Binfield pulled off an excellent 2-0 win at Harrow Borough in the Velocity Cup on Tuesday evening.

Daniel Lewis bagged the opening goal after 13 minutes while Tyler D'Cruz grabbed the second after 25 minutes.
