GROUND REGULATIONS AT FARM PARK, KINGSHILL AVENUE, HAYES, MIDDLESEX, UB4 8DD TEL: 020 8845 0110

All persons entering the ground must comply with the following **Ground Regulations**.

Failure to do so may result in being asked to leave the ground and a ban from attending any future events in the ground.

Admission and the right to remain within the ground is on condition that all persons refrain from the following acts:

1. Failure to comply with any legal directions given by a club official, steward or police officer.
2. Entering the field of play before, during or after the game.
3. Using obscene or abusive language.
4. Making racial or other forms of abuse.
5. Consuming alcohol in bottles, glasses, cans or any other container within the ground boundary. The taking of drugs or being under

the influence of drugs.

6. Climbing on any building, wall, fence or floodlights.
7. The use of horns, hooters or any musical instrument that will affect the enjoyment of others.
8. No animals permitted in the ground with the exception of guide dogs.
9. The throwing of any missile, object or projectile.

In addition all emergency exits, walkways and approaches to the ground must be kept clear at all times.

The club committee reserves the right to amend, add to or update these regulations as and when necessary.

Directions - From the ground, aim for the Cranford Parkway Interchange via The Parkway/A312 and merge on to the M4 taking the fifth exit on the Interchange.

Exit the M4 at Junction 10 on to A329 (M) towards Reading (E).. Continue on to A3290 then at Sutton Seeds Roundabout take 1st exit on to London Road (A4). After a mile turn right on to Sidmouth Street then right on to Queens Road (A329). Follow A329 via Forbury Rd, Vastern Rd going over several roundabouts.

At the roundabout signposted A4155 Industrial Areas, take the 2nd exit on to Caversham Road (A4155). At Caversham Bridge Roundabout take 1st exit on to Richfield Avenue, Go through one roundabout and continue on to Cow Lane. At roundabout take 2nd exit to Portman Rd then continue on to Wigmore Lane. At roundabout take third exit on to Oxford Road/A329 then turn right on to Scours Lane and turn left to stay on Scours Lane for destination.

It may be the best part of eight months until the players of both Isuzu FA Trophy and FA Vase finals fulfil their childhood dreams and walk out under the arch of Wembley but ask each of every club left in the two premier Non-League competitions and excitement levels are already reaching fever pitch!

Recently, the FA Trophy third qualifying round draw was made, involving all clubs from Step Three of the pyramid.

And it was another landmark week in the Vase calendar too with the first round 'proper' was drawn from the hat.

We all love a stat so each week in The NLP, when such draws are made, we join forces with our friends from Factfile, who provide us with all the top stats and trends from the FA Cup, Trophy and Vase ahead of each round. Provided by Phil Annets, author of 'FA Cup 150' short-listed Football Book of the Year 2022, the facts and figures always make for fascinating reading and are readily available on X or other social media streams.

This week, Phil has surpassed himself with his Trophy tales as the Step Four hopefuls look to continue their road to Wembley against those from a higher level.

Five clubs; Hadley, Littlehampton Town, Flackwell Heath, Horndean and Newton Aycliffe enter third qualifying round territory for the first time, as do the only competition debutants left in the hat, Real Bedford, They travel to Bowers & Pitsea on Saturday.

Barton Rovers have got to this stage for the first time in 24 years and Karl Marginson's Trafford for the first time in 22, while Herne Bay will be hoping that victory at Chichester City will take them into the first round for the

first time in their 13th campaign. Congleton Town, who host Hyde United, are eyeing a first round berth for the first time in 27 years.

City of Liverpool's reward for registering a record FA Trophy victory (4-0 against Pontefract Collieries in the last round), is a home tie against last season's semi-finalists Macclesfield FC.

The Isuzu FA Vase draw is equally as fascinating after a record-breaking second qualifying round.

An incredible 6-6 draw between Aylestone Park and Clay Cross Town is the first such scoreline in FA Vase history, while Chadderton FC's 8-4 win over Retford United is only the third such scoreline.

Cranfield United travel to Tividale for their first ever first round appearance at their 11th attempt, while eight debutant clubs are still left in the competition; Allscott Heath, FC Hartlepool, Foley Meir, Rayleigh Town, Sturminster Newton United, Sutton United (Birmingham), Windsor and Eton and Wombwell Town.

Stonehouse Town, of the Hellenic League, travel to Downton for their first first-round tie in 49 years in the ninth campaign back in the competition. The biggest winners of the last round, Daventry Town, will be looking to follow up their 7-0 victory over Rushden & Higham United – a biggest ever in their Vase history - with a win at Highgate United, while Sturminster Newton United and Okehampton Argyle – who both also recorded best ever FA Vase wins in the last round – go head to head to continue their record runs.

While the Trophy continues today, the Vase takes a break until October 19.
