


ASHFORD TOWN (MIDDX)

The Greens have won the Senior Cup a record 15 times and last season reached the semi-finals, pictured above, when they went down to Hayes & Yeading United.

However, Rayners Lane are the current holders, defeating Hayes & Yeading 3-2 in the final.

Hendon last lifted the Middlesex Senior Cup in the 2017-18 season when they defeated Staines Town 5-4 in a penalty-spot shoot-out after the showpiece game ended in a 0-0 draw.

Ashford Town (Middx) reached the final of this competition in 2012-13 but suffered a 2-0 defeat to Staines Town. Despite the loss, it was a fine achievement by The Tangerines to reach the final.




WELCOME NOTES

Good evening everyone and a warm welcome to Hendon for this Middlesex County FA Senior Cup Second Round tie at Cobham along with the referee Neil Morrison and his assistants Nigel Hickes and Pavel Krastev.

After a few seasons competing in the Southern League, Hendon have now returned to the Isthmian League this season and are currently standing in eighth position in the Premier Division.

Senior Cups are something of a lottery for those of us at Steps Four and Five as it is difficult to gauge the strength of the opposition beforehand, simply because clubs at a higher level, or some of them at least, rarely play a complete first team preferring to use their squad players or even their youth side. This



season, for example, Amersham Town have seen off Chesham United in the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup, while Redhill have beaten Woking and, even more surprising, Sheerwater have beaten Sutton United, the last two in the Surrey Senior Cup.

Both Hendon and ourselves received a bye into the Second Round and there weren't many surprises in the First Round of the Middlesex Senior Cup, except maybe, that Northwood knocked out Brentford B, the latter having actually won the competition in recent seasons only then to lose to Rayners Lane. In the Second Round, Bedfont Sports have already beaten Barnet.

Last week we entertained Balham in the Surrey Senior Cup and managed a 2-1 win. Frankly it was all a bit scrappy and if truth be told we were rather fortunate, some of the football from Balham belying their lowly position. We had several players missing but it took until the last five minutes for the winning goal to arrive, popped home by Scott Day. We are at home to South Park in the Second Round but the date has not yet been published.

On Saturday we travelled to Raynes Park Vale to meet Kingstonian again, following our earlier 7-4 win earlier in the season. We were poor in the first half apart from our defending, which restricted K's to a single goal scored early on. We couldn't get going but it was a different story in the second half as we had most of the play, with chances to equalise but we comfortably held our own against a club hell bent on promotion.

New players have been arriving in recent weeks including two old faces in Elliott Poley and Rhys Paul. Prince Kandolo was back on Saturday following injury while both David Nyarko and Alexander Payne made their debuts.

Back to our visitors who have not played for 10 days but their recent results have seen them drawing 0-0 at home to Lewes and beating Dulwich Hamlet 3-0, also at home, preceded by a 1-0 defeat away to Bowers and Pitsea. In the FA Cup they beat Whitehawk but then lost 3-0 to Herne Bay, who had knocked us out in the previous round by a 2-0 margin. In the FA Trophy, they enjoyed a 5-1 win over Bedford Town but then lost 5-0 away to Hanwell Town.

After tonight, we play here at Cobham again, this coming Saturday, in a home league match against Uxbridge., kick-off 3pm. **Enjoy the game.**

REVIEW: Kingstonian had been slowly reeling leaders Farnham Town in, helped by a seven-match winning run.

The last side to defeat the K's - and indeed the only side to take any points off them since August Bank Holiday Monday - were **Ashford** Town (Middx), with a remarkable 7-4 win on 8th October, and the sides met again at Raynes Park with the K's looking for a little revenge and eyeing that top spot.

Kingstonian went ahead on 13 minutes courtesy of Bradley Wilson's 14th goal of the season- but as he'd also scored the last time they met he certainly wouldn't have been taking anything for granted. The second half saw no further goals, and the K's held on to

make it eight wins from eight- and remain a point behind the leaders.

Farnham Town hoped to hold onto their pole position and make it four wins in a rowand perhaps record a fourth consecutive clean sheet- but they knew they were unlikely to have an easy afternoon as their visitors were third place Raynes Park Vale.

The visitors went ahead seven minutes before hal- time, Cameron Black the scorer, but Town hit back on 63 minutes Joseph Jackson with the equaliser, and seven minutes from time they went ahead, although it took an own goal to do it. What they had, they held- despite Vale's best efforts, and they also held onto their one-point lead at the top.

GROUND IMPROVEMENTS LATEST

Recently, we broke ground at Ashford Town Football Club's Robert Parker Stadium in Middlesex, marking the start of construction on a state-of-the-art artificial grass pitch. This significant development will replace the current grass surface, which has been plagued by poor weather conditions and limited usability for players.

The new 106m x 70m stadium pitch, designed to meet FIFA Quality Pro standards, will provide an all-weather facility that can be used year-round. Once complete, it will provide local teams, schools, and community groups with a high-quality playing surface, expanding opportunities for everyone to participate in sport. The facility will help foster a thriving and inclusive environment for players of all ages and abilities.

PST Sport is delighted to partner with Ashford

Town FC on this transformative project. The construction will involve full groundworks, the installation of an enhanced drainage system and a dynamic stone base. The playing surface will feature Biplex 52, a high performance artificial grass laid over a preformed shock pad. BiPlex 52, specifically designed for heavily used pitches, incorporates two different fibres in each tuft, ensuring excellent appearance and resilience even under intense use.

Key elements of the project include the installation of 352m of spectator fencing, boundary fencing, recycled trek boards, and 8 no. 15m floodlights. For added safety, the pitch will also feature 60m of 15m high ball-stop netting and pitch divider netting, making it a versatile and secure facility.

The new pitch will be a major asset to both Ashford Town FC and the wider community, supporting the continued growth of sport in the area and providing a top-quality playing surface for all.

HENDON HISTORY

Hendon are now into their 15th season under the ownership of its supporters, following their takeover of the club in the summer of 2010.

The 2024-25 season sees the club transferred back to the Isthmian League following six campaigns in the Southern League, having transferred over in 2018 after 55 years continuous membership of the Isthmian League

The new season sees Lee Allinson begin his fifth full season in charge having been appointed in November 2019 with the club rooted in the bottom three of the Southern League Premier South Division.

In September 2020 he gained his first piece of silverware lifting the 2019-20 London Senior Cup courtesy of a 1-0 win over Brentford 'B'.

Allinson replaced Jimmy Gray who had worked marvels keeping the club at Step Three in 2018-19 after replacing the long-serving Gary McCann, who left after 13 and a half years, and having to build a squad from scratch.

The 2017-18 season saw the club finish third in the league, and ultimately lose on penalties to Dulwich Hamlet in the play-off final - the second time the club have lost a play-off final having been beaten by Margate three years earlier.

However, 2018 did see some silverware as Staines Town were beaten in the Middlesex Senior Cup Final - a game that also ended in a shoot-out. The club has an illustrious and proud history, and the club was formed in 1908, beginning its existence as Christchurch Hampstead. In the very first season, the club finished as Champions of the Finchley & District League Third Division. There was regular success in the early years, but not before the first of four name changes!

Ahead of the 1909-10 season, the club renamed itself as Hampstead Town, and immediately won the Second Division title, and the First Division title followed a year later.

Further successes followed as the club entered sides in both the London and Middlesex Leagues, and on the back of this, the club was elected into the Athenian League in 1914, reaching the top end of the amateur game just six years into the club's existence.

In 1963, the club were accepted into the Isthmian League and this is where the club stayed until 2018, always playing in the top division. Success continued as they finished runners-up in their first season, followed by the first of two Championships a year later.

A further title followed in 1973, with 1966, 1974 and 2015 seeing the club finish second. Indeed, in their first 11 seasons in the Isthmian League, Hendon never finished lower than sixth.

Since then the club has had both good and bad seasons in the league, and in 2006 the club was reprieved from relegation due to Canvey Island taking a voluntary relegation of three levels from Conference National.

FOCUS ON HENDON

Hendon have returned to their traditional home in the Pitching In Isthmian League this season after a spell in the Southern League.

The Greens are holding their own in the Premier Division, in a respectable eighth position.

Their last outing in the League was on 9th November when they were held to a 0-0 draw by Lewes.

On Bonfire Night, they put in a sizzling performance with a 3-0 victory over Dulwich Hamlet.

All the goals came in the last 17 minutes with Lonit Talia opening the scoring in the 73rd.

Dave Diedhiou added the second six minutes while Niko Muir completed the scoring in time added on.

Halloween is over and the bonfires have put out. Aside from being Santa's final call, that can only mean one thing... the Isuzu FA Trophy and FA Vase are now in full swing with a dream date at Wembley becoming ever more vivid.

Last week, the Vase was whittled down to the last 64, this week it's the turn of the Trophy to enter its final qualification round before the big boys from the National League enter the fray in the third round.

This afternoon, the 48 clubs from National League North and South join the 32 Trident League clubs that have battled their way through to the Trophy second round.

Eight Step Four clubs remain with Coleshill Town and Hadley FC both drawn at home (against Biggleswade Town and AFC Telford United respectively) as two of 14 clubs looking to reach the last 64 for the first time ever.

Southern League Division One South leaders Yate Town also have a home game, against Step Two side Hampton & Richmond, while all five other Step Fourclubs are drawn away from home. Brentwood Town, Sporting Khalsa and Felixstowe & Walton United all also trip to Step Two opposition in Hereford, Oxford City and Boreham Wood as they bid to reach the last 64 for the first time.

Sittingbourne's visit of Winchester City in one of three ties where the winner will either equal or set their best run. Stockton Town v Scarborough Athletic is the only one of the three to guarantee a club reaches a first-ever last 64 berth.

Three former winners are involved in this second round. Brackley Town (2017-18) and Hornchurch (2020-21) both have away trips to Hashtag United and Enfield Town

respectively, while Kidderminster Harriers (1986-87) host Halesowen Town in a crunch West Midlands derby,

National League North high-flyers Curzon Ashton will have revenge on their minds when they host runaway Northern Premier League leaders Macclesfield at the Tameside Stadium following the Silkmen's 2-0 win last season on route to the semi-finals.

Weston-super-Mare, however, will be looking to end a 42-year wait to avenge a 1-0 replay loss to Weymouth.

Of the last 64 In the FA Vase, 11 still remain from Step 6 with three of those guaranteed a place in the fourth round, just four steps from the final under the arch.

Abbey Hulton United were rewarded for their fine 2-0 win at Step Five Atherstone Town with a home tie against Droitwich Spa, who also recorded an away win over higher-level opposition, beating Ashby Ivanhoe 3-1.

Atherton Laburnum Rovers toppled Step Five Abbey Hey 4-1 away and now host Ashton Town, while Vase debutants Sutton United (Birmingham), 2-0 winners at Midland Premier side Tividale, travel to fellow Step Six club Winsford United, who were 6-1 winners over Darwen.

Three other Step Six clubs produced shock victories over higher-level opposition last weekend. Okehampton Argyle beat Thornbury Town 2-0 away, Windsor & Eton walloped Hilltop 5-0 at home, and Clay Cross Town, the competition's top scorers with 19 goals, knocked out Stourport Swifts 4-3 away to reach the third round for the first time in 15 years.
