It will be four years on 12th April since we launched the online Daily Grunch.

This replaced the traditional Rural Grunch, which we had published and printed since March 2009.

We made the decision to go online following the Covid 19 Lockdown that came into effect on 23rd March 2020.

After Covid 19, the UK has suffered a costof-living crisis and it is safe to say we would not have been able to continue the magazine in its traditional form due to the increase in prices for paper and print.

As indicated in its title, we are able to update the online magazine on a daily basis and we do this 300 times a year.

This allows us to give coverage of local community events almost immediately after they have taken place rather than wait up to 31 days, which was the case with the printed monthly issue.

The same applies with advertising as we can insert material almost as soon as we

TAKE A SHORT CUT BY SUE

Many people are now reading The Daily Grunch but for some it is a new experience.

For a few, it may be too many clicks or you cannot remember the name of the website.



FOCUS ON THE VILLAGER BUS

The Villager Bus is run by volunteers for the North Bedfordshire communities. There are scheduled routes each week and it can be hired for outings.

The new bus can take up to 16 passengers including space for one wheelchair user. It has a low floor for easy access and a wheelchair ramp, as well as air conditioning, WiFi and phone charging points.

The Villager Bus provides regular bus services from the North Bedfordshire villages to various destinations, including Olney, Bedford, Milton Keynes, Rushden Lakes and St Ives. Concessionary Bus Passes can be used as well as payment by card or cash. Currently the cost of a single journey to any destination is only £2.

The purchase of the new bus was made possible with the generous support of various sponsors including Bedford Borough Council, the Harpur Trust, The Gale Family Charity Trust, Felmersham and Radwell Community Trust, Wixamtree Trust, The Connolly Foundation and the Christopher H R Reeves Trust.

The Villager Bus is a service for all, helping everyone to get out to town centres and local supermarkets. It has been run entirely by volunteers since 1987 with the aim of improving the lives of those in the North Beds villages.

The service supports many older people and those with mobility problems who may find it difficult to travel on their own. It's a great opportunity to socialise too! We currently deliver between 250 and 300 passenger journeys a month as well as frequent community hires.







Eggs Benedict Gordon Ramsay - BBc Good Food

3tbsp white wine vinegar4 eggs2 toasting muffins4 Parma ham

For The Hollandaise Sauce

125g butter
2 egg yolks
½ tsp white wine vinegar or tarragon vinegar
squeeze of lemon juice
pinch of cayenne pepper

□ Bring a deep saucepan of water to the boil (at least two litres) and add 3tbsp of white wine vinegar.Lower the heat down to a gentle simmer. Break the eggs into four separate coffee cups or ramekins. Split the muffins, toast them for a few minutes on both sides and warm some plates.

To Make The Hollandaise Sauce

□ Melt the butter in a saucepan and skim any white solids from the surface. Keep the butter warm. Put the egg yolks, white wine or tarragon vinegar, a pinch of salt and a splash of ice cold water in a metal or glass bowl that will fit over a small pan. Whisk for a few minutes then put the bowl over a pan of barely simmering water and whisk continuously until pale and thick, about 3-5 minutes. Remove from the heat and slowly whisk in the melted butter bit by bit until you have a creamy Hollandaise. Season with lemon juice and cayenne pepper. Keep warm.

□ Swirl the vinegared water briskly to form a vortex, add an egg and cook for 2-3 minutes. Repeat with other eggs. Spread some sauce on each muffin, crunch some ham on top then top with an egg. Spoon over remaining Hollandaise sauceand serve at once.


